The district will continue to use local data to inform decision-making. We will adjust procedures if necessary and communicate those changes as they occur.

Prevention Practices	<ul> <li>School nurses will be the main point of contact for COVID-19 at each school.</li> <li>Parents/Guardians are asked to monitor the health of their child and keep children home if they are ill.</li> <li>Parents/Guardians are asked to contact the school immediately if their son or daughter tests positive for COVID-19.</li> <li>Parents/Guardians whose student exhibits symptoms and have chosen to have the student tested, SHOULD NOT send him/her back to school until they receive a negative test result. Students cannot attend school while they await test results.</li> <li>Encourage social distancing measures as much as possible.</li> <li>Post signage in classrooms, hallways, and entrances to communicate how to stop the spread of COVID-19.</li> <li>Hand sanitizer will be provided.</li> <li>Masks optional.</li> <li>Enhanced Cleaning and disinfecting will take place at all facilities.</li> <li>Impacted areas/classrooms will be isolated and deep cleaned.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>A protocol for students/staff who feel ill/experience symptoms when at school will be implemented.</li> </ul>
Transportation	<ul> <li>Hand sanitizer will be provided on buses.</li> <li>Frequently touched surfaces on buses will be cleaned after each route.</li> <li>Buses will be sanitized after each route.</li> </ul>

Support for Teaching and	Limit sharing of supplies.
Learning	Encourage social distancing.
	<ul> <li>Use of hand sanitizer in classrooms.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Clean/disinfect frequently touched surfaces.</li> </ul>
Student/Staff tests positive for	<ul> <li>Following DPH and CDC guidelines, it is recommended that those who test positive</li> </ul>
COVID	for COVID-19 stay home a minimum of 5 days, from test date or onset of symptoms
	<b>AND</b> be fever-free for 24 hours with other symptoms improving before returning to school/work.
	<ul> <li>Absences for positive students should be excused with a parent or doctor's note.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Staff members with COVID-19 are required to use sick leave.</li> </ul>
Student/Staff who become sick at school	<ul> <li>Symptoms will be evaluated by the school nurse, and based on this evaluation, staff members may be sent home.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Students will remain in isolation, with supervision, while parents are contacted to pick them up.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Students must be fever-free for 24 hours before returning to school.</li> </ul>
Student/Staff exposed to	<ul> <li>Student/Staff who are exposed to someone who tests positive for COVID-19 should</li> </ul>
COVID-19	attend school/work as long as they are symptom free.
	<ul> <li>Parents/Guardians who choose to isolate their student due to exposure to COVID-19</li> </ul>
	should provide a parent/doctor note upon returning to school.
