

Stephens County School System 2022-2023 COVID-19 Response Plan

Stephens County School System looks forward to welcoming our teachers/staff and students back for the 2022-2023 school year. The safety of our students, staff, and families is the top priority of our school system. Please see our COVID-19 Response Plan below. The district will continue to use local data to inform decision-making. We will adjust procedures if necessary and communicate those changes as they occur.

Prevention Practices	 School nurses will be the main point of contact for COVID-19 at each school. Parents/Guardians are asked to monitor the health of their child and keep children home if they are ill. Parents/Guardians are asked to contact the school immediately if their son or daughter tests positive for COVID-19. Parents/Guardians whose student exhibits symptoms and have chosen to have the student tested, SHOULD NOT send him/her back to school until they receive a negative test result. Students cannot attend school while they await test results. Encourage social distancing measures as much as possible. Post signage in classrooms, hallways, and entrances to communicate how to stop the spread of COVID-19. Hand sanitizer will be provided. Masks optional. Enhanced Cleaning and disinfecting will take place at all facilities. Impacted areas/classrooms will be isolated and deep cleaned.
	 A protocol for students/staff who feel ill/experience symptoms when at school will be implemented.
Transportation	 Hand sanitizer will be provided on buses. Frequently touched surfaces on buses will be cleaned after each route. Buses will be sanitized after each route.

Student/Staff tests positive for	 Following DPH and CDC guidelines, it is recommended that those who test positive
COVID	for COVID-19 stay home a minimum of 5 days, from test date or onset of symptoms
	AND be fever-free for 24 hours with other symptoms improving before returning to school/work.
	 Absences for positive students should be excused with a parent or doctor's note.
	 Staff members with COVID-19 are required to use sick leave.
Student/Staff who become sick at school	 Symptoms will be evaluated by the school nurse, and based on this evaluation, staff members may be sent home.
	 Students will remain in isolation, with supervision, while parents are contacted to pick them up.
	 Students must be fever-free for 24 hours before returning to school.
Student/Staff exposed to	 Student/Staff who are exposed to someone who tests positive for COVID-19 should
COVID-19	attend school/work as long as they are symptom free.
	 Parents/Guardians who choose to isolate their student due to exposure to COVID-19
	should provide a parent/doctor note upon returning to school.
